Academic faculty, healthcare practitioners, post-doctoral fellows, students, and anyone engaged in designing and delivering curriculum, performing research, or providing instruction and oversight of professionals in training are encouraged to submit.

SUGGESTED TOPICS BY SYMPOSIUM THEME

Disparities

- Navigating cultural diversity, bias, and the legacy of racism in health disparities
- Social determinants of health related to palliative care
- Scales, assessments, and other tools to identify social determinants and quantify effects
- Advancing access and equity and decreasing barriers to care
- Meeting the needs of unique populations

Distress

- Reflections on the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on clinicians and patients
- Managing moral distress, compassion fatigue, and burnout
- Developing skills for "delivering difficult news" in sensitive situations
- Building skills for self-care and managing ethical dilemmas
- Organizational resilience and systemic responses to distress
- · Healing and hope after trauma and loss

ABSTRACT DETAILS

Please submit only one abstract per application. Multiple applications are welcome.

Submissions must include:

- Your name, credentials, title, bio, and contact information
- Presentation title (maximum 10 words)
- Presentation Type
 - Individual Paper (15 min per presentation, incl. Q&A)
 - Panel Session (60-minute session)
 - Workshop (60-minute session)
 - Poster (at least one author must attend the conference)
- Abstract summary of presentation (maximum 500 words)
- For Paper and Poster presentations of research findings, abstracts must include Background, Study aims, Study methods (design, sample, measures), Results, and Conclusions
- For Workshops, include time-ordered agenda and note interactive methods and portions
- For Panel sessions describe all topics to be presented, and list presenting speakers (All speakers will need to complete profiles in the abstract submission portal.)
- A 100-word summary of the presentation for the Symposium program
- For Paper submissions, selection to display the Paper as a Poster if it is not selected. (Application will allow you to select Yes or No)
- Two or three learning objectives with an action verb following the phrase: "At the conclusion of this session or poster review, the participants will be able to . . . " (maximum 20 words per objective, not including lead-in phrase)
- Primary focus of presentation
 - Teaching
 - Research
 - Practice
- Author bio (200 words maximum)
- Additional speakers or authors: list all or none/NA.
- Approval of terms and conditions.

Submission of the application constitutes a commitment by the author(s) to present at the Symposium, and to be photographed and/or video-recorded at the conference. **Commercial posters and promotional presentations for consulting services and/or products are not permitted.**

If your presentation is selected, final materials will be due no later than Monday, January 17, 2022.
